2. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

HAZARD DESIGNATION

"Xi" - Irritant

R36/37/38 - Irritating to eyes, respiratory system and skin.

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

IMMEDIATE CONCERNS: Harmful if swallowed. Aspiration hazard.

POTENTIAL HEALTH EFFECTS

EYES: Causes eye irritation.

SKIN: May cause skin irritation.

SKIN ABSORPTION: Skin absorption can occur.

INGESTION: Harmful if swallowed.

INHALATION: Prolonged or excessive inhalation may cause respiratory tract irritation.

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF OVEREXPOSURE

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

EYES: Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Get immediate medical attention.

SKIN: Immediately wash skin with soap and plenty of water. Remove contaminated clothing. Get medical attention if symptoms occur. Wash clothing before reuse.

INGESTION: Aspiration hazard. If swallowed, vomiting may occur spontaneously, but do not induce. If vomiting occurs, keep head below hips to prevent aspiration into lungs. Call a physician immediately.

INHALATION: Remove to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

FLASHPOINT AND METHOD: None to boiling point --- TAG CC

HAZARDOUS COMBUSTION PRODUCTS: Smoke, fumes and oxides of carbon.

FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT: As in any fire, wear self-contained breathing apparatus pressure-demand, (MSHA/NIOSH approved or equivalent) and full protective gear.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

SMALL SPILL: Avoid runoff into storm sewers and ditches which lead to waterways.

GENERAL PROCEDURES: Dike area to contain spill. Take precautions as necessary to prevent contamination of ground and surface waters. Recover spilled material on adsorbent, such as sawdust or vermiculite, and sweep into closed containers for disposal. After all visible traces, including vapors, have been removed thoroughly wet vacuum the area. Do not flush to sewer. If area of spill is porous, remove as much contaminated earth, gravel, etc. as necessary and place in closed containers for disposal.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

GENERAL PROCEDURES: Wash thoroughly after handling. Use only in a well ventilated area. Follow all MSDS/label precautions even after container is emptied because they may retain product residues. Store in a cool dry place.
